



APLIQUICK is a new revolutionary technique for appliqué, traditional or contemporary. This Apliquick technique is innovative, quick, easy and perfect for appliqué projects, not only for small pieces but also for large ones.

During this class you will learn how to make a perfect medium-size appliqué project as well as a miniature one. You will discover how easy it is to adapt the different metallic sticks to your project. Finally, you will learn how to realize any kind of shapes, sharp-pointed hexagons, curves and many more. Rosa will demonstrate how to machine appliqué the small pieces, but the class will mainly be hand-work.

Hawaiian with APLIQUICK®TM

In this class we will know the fantastic world of Hawaiian. Each student will design their own Hawaiian block. You will learn all the techniques for your design, until you reach the perfect technique (for the design) with APLIQUICK ... easier, faster and perfect.





SUPPLY LIST

- Pen to draw on paper and eraser.
- Ruler 24" approx.
- Rotary cutter.
- Cutting Mat 24" x 24" (or less).
- Large, fine (if possible and better) flat-headed pins.
- Scissors for fabric (small and medium).
- Coloured pencil or pen (non-iron erasable!) to draw some lines on the fabric.
- Iron (not small iron)
- Batting 60" x 60"
- 2 pieces of different fabric, contrast between them (don't use black, please!) Size 45" x 45" (one for background, one for our design).
- APLIQUICK ®™ tools
- Fabric glue
- 4 white paper sheets

APLIQUICK® TM MASTER CLASS

In this course you will learn the technique for the realization of perfect applications. A medium piece will be made to learn how to use the APLIQUICKS perfectly. A miniature will be made to learn with ease that this new technique gives to make extremely small pieces. Finally, you will learn to make any type of shape, angles (open approximately 90 degrees to the most closed, so that the peaks of the perfect pieces remain), circles, hexagons, among others.

- APLIQUICK rods
- Small scissors
- Fabric glue
- Tweezers
- Pencil to draw on the stabilizer
- Spiral notebook
- Small iron and small iron board
- Kit of Japanese Fabrics, fliseline and pattern (supplied by APLIQUICK, approx. price \$US20 or Cdn equivalent).
