

- 10 2 ½" squares of various fabrics that read as one colour. The colour should be bright and bold (crayon box colours). They can be from different fabrics solids, tone-on-tone or prints, as long as they read as the same colour. Put the 10 squares in an envelope and put the name of the colour on the front of the envelope.

September 17 - We will present a new challenge and a mystery quilt and we are looking for a speaker.


WORKSHOP

October 8 - Quilted Jacket or Vest with Lynda Gowling.

Make a quilted vest or simple jacket without set-in sleeves. Prepare the quilted top layer over the summer and put it together at the workshop in October.

The vest pattern suggested by Lynda is similar to the vest in the patchwork examples below. The jacket pattern she suggests is:

More than official variations (or "Views"), **this pattern has options**, **lots of them**. Sew a crop length cardigan, a mid length cardigan, or a long coat.

- **during summer** Lynda suggests making a muslin and you will be doing the piecing to make the outer layer of the garment
- **September 10** at 1pm to discuss final preparations for the workshop.


Cost: \$20 (minimum 15 participants)


Thank you to Patricia H for putting together the survey. Following are the charts for the first two questions on the survey. 51 members completed the survey.
